MOVING MOUNTAINS FOR MACMILLAN

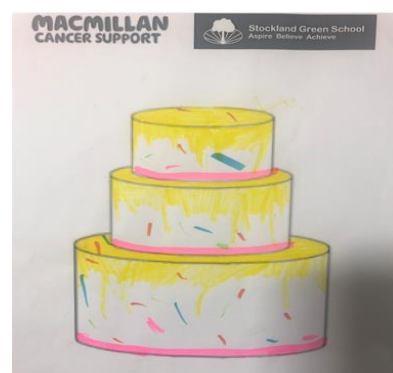
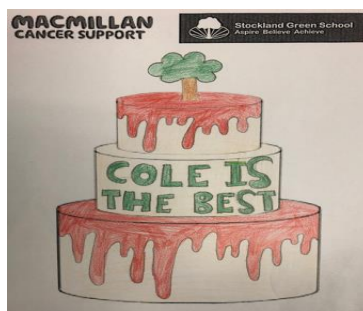
